we look forward to the upcoming exhibitions in our art museum!

Due to the Covid-19 pandemic, the preview cannot take place in the current way. Therefore, we are grateful to be able to offer this alternative format:

On 15.10.2020 the Kunstmuseum opens its doors for the members for the extended preview from 4.30 pm to 7.30 pm. The curators of the exhibitions Ute Stuffer and Kristina Groß will be present, as well as art mediators (Adrienne Hölz and Michael Borrasch) on each floor for explanations and information. Registration for a time window below is required.

Three exciting exhibitions await us:

EMEKA OGBOH. THE WAY EARTHLY THINGS ARE GOING (2. OG)

For the first time in Germany, the Kunstmuseum Ravensburg is showing the inhouse sound and light installation THE WAY EARTHLY THINGS ARE GOING (The Run of Earthly Things) by Emeka Ogboh (*1977, lives in Berlin), which the Nigerian artist conceived in 2017 for documenta 14 in Athens. It arose in the course of his confrontation with the effects of the international financial crisis, in particular with the Greek economic crisis. The title of the work is from the lyrics "So Much Trouble in the World" by Bob Marley. The multi-channel installation combines a polyphonic ancient Greek lament with stock market data of the world stock indices, which are transferred to an LED band in real time. Ogboh puts the ongoing reports of capital markets – such as the reaction of stock

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prices to the Corona crisis – in dialogue with the poignant chant about forced migration and the search for a better life. The expansive composition of sound and light raises questions that will continue to move us in 2020.

FOCUS: EXPRESSIONISM. SELINKA COLLECTION (1ST FLOOR)

The foundation of the Kunstmuseum Ravensburg Art Museum is the Selinka Collection. About two-thirds of the collection consists of works of German Expressionism, mainly works by the artist group Brücke (1905-1913). With numerous prints, such as the characteristic woodcuts as well as watercolours and paintings, the exhibition focuses on the 1910s and gives an insight into the extensive new frames that have taken place in the museum over the last two years. The young artists, who rebelled against the cramped social and political structures as well as traditional painting at the beginning of the 20th century, embodied a new way of life. Her works are an expression of an inner perception. It was not the image of reality, but the "feeling" of content that took centre stage.

THE BLUE BIRD. CORNEILLE FROM CHILDREN'S EYES (EC)

Exclusive vernissage for children: Friday, October 23, 11 a.m.-5 p.m.

An exhibition of children for children. Based on the coloured prints by the Dutch artist Corneille (1922-2010), a participatory project with children was implemented in the museum's collection room. Corneille is one of the founding members of the artist group CoBrA (1948-1951), which is one of the focal points of the Selinka Collection. The CoBrA artists themselves found inspiration in children's drawings, in the "spontaneous feeling of life" reproduced. It was Corneille who, in the fourth Cobra issue, juxtaposed the works of Karel Appel, Constant and himself with various children's drawings.
